# GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Brother Knights,

Coincidence, or something else at work? Have you ever encountered a situation in your life where something happens, and you realize that it was a coincidence that you were there to get involved and offer assistance? Maybe the "stars" were aligned just right so that things worked out for the best, and all was right with the world. As I get older I realize that there are other influences that affect how things turn out in life and, although we may not understand all of it, somehow things seem to work out as they should.



In my working life my wife and I moved many times all over the United States and even spent time living in a foreign country. We found ourselves involved on four different occasions where we had the opportunity to offer help to unwed mothers or providing a home for a young girl who couldn't live at home anymore. All of these opportunities were presented to us through the Catholic Charities organization at the Church we were attending at the time, and my wife and I felt we wanted to do something to help out. On another occasion I was asked to assist on a project to renovate Incarnation Parish in Charlottesville, Virginia, but because we were so new to the parish I suggested that I would work as an assistant to Julian, a very capable and experienced parishioner and Project Leader. The day after my role was announced to the Parishioners, Julian suffered a very serious stroke and was incapacitated. When I visited him in the hospital he was able to communicate to me that I should keep the faith and move the project ahead as planned. Coincidentally, a substantial endowment became available through the Diocese of Richmond, and two

years later, after many meetings, planning sessions and prayers, the renovation was completed and serves that Catholic Community to this day. I firmly believe that it is more than coincidence that affects our lives and it just may be God's plan for us unfolding as it should.

### GRACIAS CABALLEROS

On Sunday, **October 3**, many of us participated in the "LIFE CHAIN" to show our disagreement with abortion, and that we believe in the sanctity of life, from womb to tomb. Ironically, just minutes after the "LIFE CHAIN" event was finished, April Suarez, a two year

old girl, was hit and killed by a drunk driver on Hilton Head Island. It was in making preparations for the wake and funeral, that I knew that I had to get the Knights of Columbus involved. I called State Deputy, Tom Monahon and asked if the Knights could be present at the wake or funeral. Literally minutes after hanging up with Tom, District Deputy, Dick Bachner called me and said "Father, we will do what ever you want". On Thursday, **October 7**, at 4:30pm, seven Sir Knights from the Assembly at Saint Gregory the Great Catholic Church in Bluffton, appeared at Saint Anthony Chapel, in Hardeeville, to stand guard for the wake.

My brother Knights, this is where I must tell you how proud and honored I was to be a Knight. For, you must understand the demographics of Saint Anthony Catholic Mission, in Hardeeville. It is made up of 50% retirees from Sun City, in Bluffton, and 50% Hispanics, living in Hardeeville.

The Vigil Service, Rosary, and visitation were attended by several hundred Hispanics late into the night. If I was asked once, I was asked one hundred times "What are los Caballeros doing here? Why are they here? How did they get here?" My response was "They respect life, and are pro family". It was then that so many of my Mexican parishioners responded, "We are happy that they are here. We recognize them from Mexico".

Our Fourth Degree Honor Guard / Color Guard, lead by Bill Gaillette, was so very helpful to me. When all of the seats were taken in the pews, my brother Sir Knights got up and offered their seats, and helped me bring out and set up more chairs for the mourners to sit on, making them feel welcome and invited. This was a true display of hospitality. Here at Saint Anthony Mission, there is no Men's Club or KOFC Council. We are in the process of beginning a Roundtable because I know that I can always call upon my brother Knights whenever I need help. This simple act of CHARITY by my brother Knights has gone a long way. For, even long after the Color Guard / Honor Guard left for the evening, I could hear my Hispanic pa-

rishioners talking about what an honor / privilege it was to have "Los Caballeros" present. Basically, what they were saying was "They care about us. They are good men." What a good impression this made. I could even hear many of the young men and boys (future Knights) say "Wow. Did you see their swords? I like their uniforms".

So, to State Deputy, Tom Monahon, District Deputy, Dick Bachner, Head of the local 4th Degree color guard, Bill Gaillette, and all of the Sir Knights that were present, I say "THANK YOU, FOR ALL THAT YOU HAVE DONE, AND FOR ALL THAT YOU WILL CONTINUE TO DO TO BUILD UP THE BODY OF CHRIST HERE AT SAINT ANTHONY MISSION".

To all of my brother Knights throughout the state, I say "Please remember, a little bit can go a long way. The 4th Degree is the 'PUBLIC IMAGE' of the Knights. They may seem like little things to you, but, the little things that you do, mean a great deal to others." Always remember, the compass always points to 'CHARITY'. VIVA JESUS, Rev. Fr. Robert F. Higgins"

Before closing, I want to remind all of you to bring your food donations to the hall for the Thanksgiving baskets. Our present 9.6% unemployment has left many families needing help again this year. Let's each do what we can to help these families.

## Forgotten Helpers

Do you recall any of the details of receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation? How about choosing your Confirmation Name? For me, that occasion was many decades ago when Archbishop O'Boyle invoked the Holy Spirit to come over me and guide me and then me promising to do my best to follow in Christ's footsteps, Amen. I was only in fourth grade at Sacred Heart School in Washington, D.C. when we received this Sacrament at the Shrine of the Sacred Heart Church at 16<sup>th</sup> and Park Rd. My folks were somewhere in the large congregation

along with my sister Patty and my grandparents who made the trip down from Lancaster, PA. My older brother Tommy was just a few feet away from me, serving the Mass and kneeling proudly in his red and white altar boy robes with his hands perfectly folded in the devout prayer position. That was also the day that we got our Confirmation Name, identifying that special Saint who we wanted to watch over us. Mine is St. Raphael, the Archangel who I learned watched over some real old folks like Tobiah and his wife Sarah. But I actually chose that name after Sister Raphael who was my teacher and who I really liked. She had visited me several times when I was in and out of Children's Hospital that year with kidney issues. Yes, it was embarrassing when I told her I wanted her name. But I did manage to awkwardly whisper it to her that day in school when she asked us to come up to her desk one by one and tell her what Confirmation Name we'd chosen. I remember Sister Raphael simply looked at me and smiled. After that, everyone would still call me "Mikie" but I immediately had visions of changing my signature to show off my new identity. But after just a few "Maurice Patrick Raphael ..." scrolled on some of my school work, Sister Raphael kindly suggested that was not really necessary because God already knew my new name. But if you're like me, there are long periods of time when we forget about these faithful silent helpers. If that's the case, perhaps we can do a little better job keeping them in our prayers. ## Knights of Columbus Charitable Initiatives

- Contributed \$75 to the recent Jubilee Celebration Reception for Sister Grace, IHM who continues to faithfully serve our parish needs
- Council 3303 & Fourth Degree Assembly 1820 split the \$1,545 cost of materials for constructing a new large deck at the rectory for Msgr. Lewis.
- Council 3303 and Fourth Degree Assembly 1820 have initiated this year's Thanksgiving Turkey Basket Dinners for needy families. Drop off non perishable canned goods at the Hall this week. Knights will buy the turkeys.
- The Council's ongoing Prescription Drug Program continues to help provide meds for qualified indigent persons at reduced or no cost. Since its inception 6 years ago, nearly \$1.9 million in reduced or free meds have been provided to needy folks.
