

K of C American Red Cross Blood Drive Draws a Huge Response

The U.S. is now facing a severe blood shortage due to a large number of blood drive cancellations during the COVID-19 pandemic, according to the American Red Cross. Eastern North Carolina is no exception. The U.S. Surgeon General has urged healthy, eligible adults to act now by giving blood. As with any crisis, many of us feel helpless and one of the ways that citizens contribute to help others is by donating blood. Fortunately, the Knights of Columbus has sponsored with the American Red Cross to host several Blood drives every year and the blood drive held on March 19th & 20th went as planned. When I arrived for my scheduled appointment, there were several people waiting in line. I know many of my Brother Knights are regular donors including Deacon Jim Hackett, who showed right after I finished. Thanks to the foresight of Brother Frank Varga, a Brother Knight since 1950 and WWII Veteran who started our relationship with the American Red Cross 21 years ago, the Knights will continue to sponsor blood drives for many years to come. As of last fall, over 8,800 units of blood have been collected in total at Columbus Club Hall translating into approximately 26, 500 lives saved. The need is constant. SK Denny Colbert currently heads our blood drives. Thanks to all of you who are eligible to give and do so.
