- **300 Club \$1,000.00 Reverse Drawing:** The drawing will be held at 6 PM on Thursday, February 18th in the Lounge of Columbus Club Hall. Family of the Month – January

Small towns do not equate to small output. Nothing exemplifies this more than the tremendous contributions made by this month's Family of the Month.

Jerry and Pam Schill both came from small towns in Northwestern Pennsylvania: Marble and Tylersburg. They met in high school and later married: now for 52 years. They have four married children, 10 grandchildren, and three great grandsons.

Jerry served in the Air Force Security Service from 1966 to 1970. It took him from Pakistan to Alaska. After leaving active duty, he worked for the US Chamber of Commerce and Pam was a secretary for an advertising agency. When they moved to New Bern, he worked in sales and then served as President for the North Carolina Fisheries Association for 30 years. Pam worked 20 years for a Nationwide agency.

The couple has been in North Carolina for 36 years. At one point, Jerry ran for the North Carolina Senate and has been involved in the Knights for 30 years. He's a past Grand Knight; he and Pam have been Santa and Mrs. Claus for 10 years at Saint Paul's school; both are active in the God and Country Christian Alliance which they help found in 1994; Jerry has been its chairman for several years.

Ron has been a Knight with our Council for over seven years and a 4th Degree Sir Knight for over five years. He has held Assembly Officer positions as Inner Sentinel and is currently serving as Pilot.

Born in Miami on January 3, 1953, Ron lived in Key West, Florida, then moved to Ft. Myers in 1962, where he graduated from high school in 1971. He then entered the United States Marine Corps in August 1972 and retired in 2002 with over 30 years of service. He served in various locations in the United States and Japan in a variety of important positions with the Marines, such as serving as a Drill Instructor at Paris Island in 1978-1981 and Drill Instructor in 1987-1989 for the Officers Candidate School at Quantico Virginia. Additionally, he served on Embassy Duty in Bangladesh, Nicaragua, and El Salvador from 1982-1987 and a second tour in Frankfurt Germany from 1991-1993 and third tour in 1997-1998 at Quantico VA. As a Battalion Sergeant Major, he met his wife Denise in Nicaragua. They have one daughter Carlyn and one granddaughter Lillianna who is two years old.

Ron is a graduate of Park University with a bachelor's degree in Business Management and Human Resources. After his retirement from the Marine Corps, he worked for the Department of State, 2002-2004, with the diplomatic security inspection team, for embassies in Pacific Rim countries. He additionally worked as an instructor for the Army Satellite communications program and was promoted to customer support manager, supporting 56 field engineers in Iraq and Afghanistan. He retired in 2012.
