Where did half of the summer go? July has crept up on us, and by now we have enjoyed tasty fruit, good stuff off the grill, and perhaps an extra bowl of ice cream or two. It's a good month to sit back, reflect and ask myself, 'how am I doing on my journey to sainthood?'

If I am physically able, do I take advantage of the scheduled face-to-face Sacrament of Confession/ Reconciliation offered at our St. Paul Church? These included: CN, DE, GA, MS, MD, NH, NJ, NY, NC, PA, RI, SC, and VA.

The document was not official until it was signed by all members of the Continental Congress which occurred in August 1776 when John Hancock added his signature. Thus, was born the familiar phrase “Put your John Hancock on it” which makes the signee aware that the covenant/document before him/her is official and binding.

Stuff the Bus



Results from the food drive were exception! And, the support provided by the KOC was also outstanding. After the 1 p.m. mass, the school bus was filled with 138 bags of groceries, Father Tom's truck was full as well as Paul Massotta's and Tim Edwards'. There was enough food stacked in the Family Life Center to fill another two trucks. When I say full, the truck beds were stacked two bag high.

The food was delivered to RCS, Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Kingston, Mother of Mercy in little Washington, and the Filling station in Pollksville. With food continuing to come in after the event another two trucks were sent to Fishers & Loaves in Oriental.

So in the end, aside from the bus, there were another six truckloads of food. Mother of Mercy counts, weights and categories everything that comes to them. They tallied 1,583.4 lbs of food (two truckloads) and 1,069 diapers. With the bus at 138 bags = to two truckloads plus the six trucks, one could estimate 838 bags of groceries and at \$20.00 a bag = \$16,560 of donated food.

Knights at each mass helped with carrying and stuffing trucks. Key personnel were Fr. Tom, Jean & Tim Edwards, Paul Massotta, Phil Barber, Mark Layel and Tim Bettcher along with some Knights of Saint George.

Council 3303 Year End Report

Memorandum To State Secretary, North Carolina Knights of Columbus

Subject: Year End Report for Monsignor James R. Jones Council 3303

1. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this memorandum is to document the Fraternal Year 2020-21 Activities for the Monsignor James R. Jones Council 3303.
2. **OVERVIEW:** This Fraternal Year was a success despite the challenges presented by the COVID 19 Pandemic. We executed our programs with major modifications. All of our Planning and Business meetings were held but some were virtual. We adjusted our charitable contributions to stay in line with reduced income. We were fortunate to receive significant funding from our Assembly Brothers. We received word from Supreme that we qualified for the Columbian Award for this FY.
3. **FUND RAISING:** Our bingo operation has been severely impacted by the restrictions imposed by the State of North Carolina due to the Covid19 crisis. We were unable to operate from April 2020 until October 2020. After reopening, our average attendance has been around 2/3 of what it was pre-covid. We have partially compensated for the lower attendance by reducing the amount of our prizes, but our net revenue is still way short of what we were used to in the pre-covid years. In the 8 years prior to Covid19, our operation averaged an annual profit of approximately \$65,000. In FY 20-21, with 2 months to go, we have only made \$21,400 and project that our final total for FY 20-21 will be around \$27,000. We hope that with vaccinations becoming available, and restrictions being eased, our operation will recover in the coming months.
4. **MEMBERSHIP:** This past year has been a good year for recruitment of new members and transferees into our council. On-Line exemplification has made the process more readily accessible and easier for new members to join. Brother Knights have been instrumental in recruiting and are to be commended for their efforts. Several new and transfer members have stepped up to contribute to many fund-raising projects to include Bingo, Yard Sales, Lenten Fish Fries, LAMB and 300 Club.
5. **FAITH IN ACTION PROGRAMS:**
 - a. **Faith Program.** Our council Faith Program is focused on support to St. Paul Parish and St. Paul Catholic School. We participated in the RSVP program to support three seminarians. We have a close working relationship with our Pastor, Father Thomas Tully and his staff. The staff lead helped us honor our widows at a reception held in the Family Life Center. Father Tully asked our council to lead one of the Sunday Celebrations for our parish Bicentennial and we were honored to do so. Our Council and Assembly contribute financial support for the publication of the Parish calendar. We provide monetary support to the parish school to be used at the discretion of the Principal. During the Christmas season we organized a visit by Santa and Mrs. Claus to each school classroom. A gift was provided to each teacher for use in the classroom. We also cooked and served a lunch to the school staff the same day that Santa visited the children.
 - b. **Family Program.** The Monsignor Jones Council 3303 displayed significant activities associated with its Faith in Action/Family Programs. One could enumerate a myriad of activities; however, we will cite a few of the more significant ones. The Council provided Thanksgiving baskets for 12 needy families in our community; Christmas cards and poinsettias were delivered to the Council widows; held Christmas card sales at St. Paul Parish; hosted a wives appreciation dinner; conducted three Lenten fish fries'; cooked a Saint Patrick's dinner in support of the Catholic Daughters; and the Council recognized a Family of the Month and a Family of the Year for its annual programs.
 - c. **Community Program.** Despite the pandemic the Council managed to continue its charitable

works in a robust manner. This past fall 70 children were provided with winter coats through the featured Coats for Kids program. Over the rest of the fall and winter months a dozen local non-profit service organizations were given stipends ranging from \$100 to \$1000, totaling \$7900. During the Christmas season we teamed with the Senior Center and funded and helped deliver almost 100 dinners to deserving families of New Bern. Most recently this Spring the Religious Community Services (RCS) of New Bern, the local county food kitchen, was presented a \$3000 check from our Council.

- d. **Life Program.** The Special Olympics Spaghetti Dinner on February 18th was a Drive Thru only event with over 100 meals being distributed. Several Brothers teamed with the Craven County Special Olympics Office to distribute the meals. Special thanks to the local Pizza Hut management and employees for supplying and cooking the delicious spaghetti dinner. This event was started by Brother Andy Yandura and has been on-going for some 30 years. The proceeds from this dinner are used to provide support to the Special Olympic organizations in Craven, Pamlico and Jones Counties. Once again, we provided monetary support to the Eastern Pregnancy Information Center. Despite COVID restrictions, the Council participated in pro-life rallies in Raleigh and Jacksonville. Through the parish Respect Life Ministry, our Council has distributed information about the status of pro-life legislation by email. That information keeps the laity informed about the nature of the legislation and the process as bills move through the committee process and on the House and Senate floor for votes.
 - e. **Youth Program.** Although COVID-19 restricted our council's ability to host a Knights of Columbus sponsored Youth Soccer Challenge and Basketball Free Throw Championship, Council 3303 maintained our dedication to supporting the Catholic youth of St. Paul parish. Financial assistance was provided to three baseball teams sponsored by St. Paul Catholic Church as well as the St. Paul chapter of the Troops of St. George, a Catholic apostolate for young men looking for a life of adventure. The youth from the Troops of St. George stepped up and assisted the Council by volunteering their time serving Lenten Fish meals.
 - f. **LAMB Program.** In March 2021 the Knights of Columbus Monsignor James R. Jones Council 3303 hosted a gathering of several representatives of the local Special Education Community. Funds obtained from generous community support to our Least Among My Brethren (LAMB) Campaign were distributed to ten organizations. Our normal Tootsie Roll Campaign was sidelined this year so many individuals and organizations, to include our parish and the City of New Bern, provided grants to help the cause. Special thanks to the Knights of Columbus LAMB Coordinators Tom Melvin and Jim Kelly. We raised almost \$7,500 in 2020 and plan to exceed that number in 2021.
6. **LOOKING AHEAD:** Our Council officers and many directors will stay in place for another year so we will not have a steep learning curve. We are working on the budget for next year and seeking to identify brothers who desire to move into leadership positions. Our Council, Assembly 1820, the Columbus Club, the Catholic Daughters and the parish and school staff have a close working relationship, and we plan to foster those ties to continue our success.
