On Saturday Sept 7 LAMB had a collection at the Food Lion on Glenburnie Rd where we collected \$405.50 for our cause. We have started to receive some checks from our mail campaign also.

As of this letter, we are scheduled for collection on Saturday Sept 21 at Piggly Wiggly on Simmons St. of which we have enough volunteers for. Meet at the store for this day. We also have an interview with Valentina Wilson of WCTI12 for a 3-minute segment at 12:12 pm on Thursday Sept 19, and a repeat on the evening news, where we will discuss the Knights, our agenda and upcoming events, and what LAMB is about. ## Knight of the Month – September

September Knight of the Month is Carlos Manuel Espinoza. Carlos was born in Guatemala City, Guatemala, Central America in 1953. In August of 1961, he and his my father immigrated to the United States via San Francisco, CA. as permanent residents.

As a newly admitted child immigrant, he learned to speak English, by watching cartoons; English is his second language. He attended catholic schools (from elementary through high school), graduating from Riordan High School (San Francisco, Ca) in 1971. In 1972, he met his wife of 48-years, Marta Araceli. Marta was born in San Salvador, El Salvador; she immigrated to the United States in 1956 as a child.

In 1976, he finished his Engineering Studies as Civil Engineer from San Francisco State University. After college he was hired by the City of San Francisco as Resident Engineer. In 1985, he was hired by Alameda County (the second largest county) in California. Alameda County offered him the opportunity to expand into buildings, with a specialty in Hospital Construction, (OSHPD Inspector).

In 1997, he joined Redwood City where he worked for an additional 16 years, until retiring in 2013. Marta retired in 2014 after 35-years of service at Stanford University, as Program Manager. They moved to the East Coast in 2014 for a brief time to Frederick, Maryland, then to North Carolina in 2017.

They are blessed to have four daughters (Jennifer Amanda, Yamileth Eugenia, Maria-Cristina and Karina Araceli) and ten grandchildren; plus, two great grandchildren. Three of their daughters live in the Raleigh area and one daughter still resides with her family in California.

For several years, while they lived in San Francisco (approx. 50-years) they attended mass at Marta's childhood parish, the Basilica of Mission Dolores (where they were married). Marta's parents were co-founders of Our Lady of Guadalupe Society at the Basilica. Eventually, they were initiated as members in 2000. A few years later, Carlos was elected President and Marta the Event Coordinator. During their time they were in office, they organized the largest celebration mass in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe on her feast day on December 12 at 4:30am (approximately 2,000 pilgrims); they were also featured on the front page of the San Francisco Chronicle Newspaper.

Their Society raised funds throughout the year by hosting events such as: Spaghetti dinner, Chicken dinner, and overnight bus trips to Reno and Las Vegas to afford hosting this blessed event.

It was on one of Our Lady's feast day celebrations that Carlos became interested in the Knights of Columbus (Honor Guards). The role of the Knights of Columbus, in Our Lady of Guadalupe celebration mass, was to lead the procession that began with police escort through the streets into the church; followed by Our Lady's Image, then the people, and at the very end the Bishop, priests (8), and deacons.

At Saint Paul, Carlos serves as a Lector and Marta as Eucharistic Minister. In the past, Marta served on the Saint Paul School Board and the Saint Paul Parochial Council.

He enjoys traveling, it has taught him many things about other cultures; Gardening – to grow their own fruits and vegetable; Fishing, Reading, and spending time with their large family.

# October 7 - Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. October includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7. The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary. The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary - known for centuries as the Feast of "Our Lady of Victory," this day takes place in honor of a naval victory which secured European Christendom against Turkish invasion in 1571. Pope St. Pius V attributed the victory at Lepanto — one of the most decisive in all of naval history according to historians — to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary through a campaign to pray the Rosary.

The Muslim Ottoman Empire had been expanding into Europe for 900 years. By 1453, they took over Christian lands in the Byzantine Empire, and continued into the Mediterranean, threatening Rome. Pope Pius V called for prayer and action. He pleaded with every man, woman, and child to pray the Rosary. He also put together the Holy League: a coalition of Catholic powers which included Genoa, Spain, and the Papal States. Its fleets sailed to confront the Turks near the west coast of Greece on October 7, 1571. They were vastly outnumbered. The Pope, Christians throughout Europe, and crew members armed themselves with the Rosary in preparation for battle. Mass was said on all 200 ships. People prayed from dawn to dusk. Christians in Europe, encouraged by the Pope, gathered to invoke the Virgin Mary against the daunting Turkish forces. They kept churches open day and night so everyone could pray and ask for Mary's help. The wind was against the Christians and the heavy iron rams (which ordinarily were used to ram and sink enemies) had been removed because over 18,000 Christian slaves were oarsmen in the galleys.

The Holy Alliance chose to handicap themselves rather than sacrifice the slaves. As the battle commenced, everyone prayed. Some accounts say that Pope Pius V was granted a miraculous vision of the Holy League's stunning victory at 4pm that day.

The Pope understood the significance of the day's events, when he was eventually informed that all but 13 of the nearly 300 Turkish ships had been captured or sunk. The victory was decisive and crushing. It marked a turning point in the history of Christianity and of Europe. Pope Pius V dedicated the day as one of thanksgiving to Our Lady of Victory. Pope Gregory XIII later changed the name to the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.
